Supervisor Brenize has a candidate who he thinks is a good choice. He is retired and a meticulous worker.

MOTION: Supervisor Brenize moved to hire Jay Booz at \$15/hour for

permanent, part-time work which is in accordance to PSATS Salary

Survey Guide. Jay will work less than 1040 hours per year.

Supervisor Hall seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Code Enforcement Officer Probation Period Ends

MOTION: Having heard nothing but good things about Code Enforcement

Officer, Jamie White, Supervisor Hall moved to end the probation period and make his employment permanent, part-time. Supervisor

Cressler seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

SUBDIVISION

Matrix Conditional Use

Maria stated the conditional use hearing for Matrix I, L.P., was held prior to the Board of Supervisors meeting. Did the supervisors wish to add conditions or table until the May 11th meeting?

MOTION: With no one wishing to add conditions, Supervisor Cressler move to

approve the Conditional Use request for Matrix I, L.P., as presented. Supervisor Hall seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

REPORTS OF TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS AND AGENCIES

<u>Draft Ordinances</u> - Solicitor Kelso will have draft ordinances for Radio Repeaters, Parking and Solar Farms at the next meeting.

<u>Furnace Run Rules and Regs</u> – Solicitor Kelso is drafting some rules and regulations for Furnace Run Park. They should be ready at the next meeting as well.

<u>Furnace Run Master Site Plan</u> – Maria reported that the Draft Master Site plan is completed. If there are any further changes they should be made prior to May $11^{\rm th}$. She will resend to everyone.

<u>NPDES</u> – Maria stated that Andrew has only done the environmental impact for the NPDES permit for Phase 1, which is the gateway park and the quarry pit. Because the Township would like to begin some work at the Phase 2 site, he thinks it would be a good idea to move forward with the environmental assessment for that area now. It will be an additional charge because it is outside of the work we've contracted; however, it will be more economical to move right into the work now while he has all of the necessary materials readily available rather than to revisit it at a later date.

Supervisor Cressler stated that because it is part of our grant application for 2022, it will need to be done anyway. He instructed Maria to get a quote from Andrew for Phase 2 NPDES.

Maria Misner stated there are some simple things the Township can do to make the park more useable right now. Putting porta potties in on an existing concrete slab at the former blue house, mow a trail around the meadow and put a sign up that says "parking" without any permitting.

<u>Chainsaw Carver's Festival</u> - Jamie White reported the Chainsaw Carver's Festival went well. There were no issues.

<u>Use of Conference Room</u> - Kathy Durf reported that Kauffman's Office would like to know if they can use the Township Conference Room to host AARP Safe Driver Training this year.

The supervisors were fine with the use of the conference room.

<u>Speed Machine Sign Board</u> – Subscription is expiring in two months. There are price breaks for two or three years.

MOTION: Supervisor Cressler moved to approve the three-year subscription

for the software for the speed machine. Supervisor Hall seconded

the motion which passed unanimously.

New Hires

Kathy Durf said she was getting calls about the status of the public works position that has been advertised for about a month. How should she respond?

Supervisor Cressler asked that copies be made of all the resumes received and submitted to each of the supervisors. They will begin to narrow it down.

ACTION ON PAYING BILLS

MOTION: Supervisor Cressler moved to pay the general fund in the amount

of \$60,021.45. Supervisor Hall seconded the motion which passed

unanimously.
